

Kumho Tire Co., Ltd. V. Camichael

Daubert applicable to technical and other non-scientific expert testimony

Minivan overturns after tire blow out, killing one and injuring others

- Plaintiffs rely upon expert's opinion, which was based upon observations and subjective analysis
- Expert opinion based upon the application of a personally developed checklist for tire failure
- Court excludes expert's testimony, "as observation and subjective analysis", enters summary judgement against plaintiff
- Kumho creates reliability in:
 - (1) How often the experience-based methodology has produced erroneous results?
 - (2) Is method generally accepted in the relevant community?
 - (3) Is method and investigation peer approved?

Case Study #4
"If I Can't See You,
You Can't See Me"




- Clear sight-lines
- Property owner installs landscape hedge
- Property owner does not maintain height of hedge for clear sight- lines
- Bicyclist is injured when pulling out onto the street because he did not see oncoming traffic



- 1. Does property owner have a duty to maintain height of hedge so that a clear sight line is established?
- 2. Does a government agency have a duty to maintain heights of plants so that clear sightlines are established?
- 3. Who has the duty when the homeowner installs and maintains subject hedge in right-of-way?

Case Study #5 Do you want to super size that?



- "Jack Leg" climbs tree and cuts his own safety harness, falls and now is a paraplegic
- Review of fast food restaurant policy manual pertaining to closing drive-thru
- Right tree, wrong place
- Property inspection of landscapes at other fast food restaurants from the same chain
- Review of landscape drawing

Case Study #6
"Not for Human
Consumption"



- •Landscape architect produces a design/build landscape proposal to client
- Client accepts the design and cost to install
- •Clients child picks angel trumpet flower and ingests part of it
- Child becomes violently ill
- •Was there negligence by architect?

- 1. Did landscape architect have a duty to inform his client that the flower of the angel trumpet tree is toxic?
- 2. If so, did the warning have to be in writing?
- 3. Does constructive knowledge play a part in this matter?
