Saturday's activities also include an Arbor Fair with educational exhibits, interactive activities, crafts by local artisans, and a fun tree climb for children and adults. Outdoor events conclude on Sunday with the Masters' Challenge Championship round of the ITCC sponsored by Husqvarna.
